

Borough of Thompsontown  
Council Meeting  
September 15, 2025  
7 PM

A regular meeting of the Borough of Thompsontown Council was held in the Thompsontown Borough Office at the new location on 121 N. Mill St., Thompsontown, PA on August 18, 2025. The following were in attendance Mayor Kenneth Hart, President Roger Stutts, Vice-President Andy Lenig, Secretary-Treasurer Sue Pontius, Councilmen/Councilwoman: Martin Wilson, Williard Roush, Connie Eaton, Nathan Claybaugh, Solicitor Mosebey and Engineer Brian Book. Councilman Robert Speece was absent. Fire Department and Municipal Authority minutes were not read due to meetings being held later in the week. Motion to approve the Financial Report was made by Andy Lenig and seconded by Connie Eaton. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Andy Lenig and seconded by Nathan Claybaugh.

President Stutts started around the room with visiting residents. Resident Abby Testament informed Council a storm came up around the light at Regester's that could have been a fire hazard. It looks like someone cleared the branches from the light. President Stutts commented this is the owner's issue.

Mark Amig acting as a liaison for Bill Hummel with Emergency Management Planning, reviewed topics given during their training sessions for co-ordination for guidance and safety. He encouraged Council to review the training and exercises available to be prepared for times of flooding, and storms. Mayor Hart is the Borough's liaison during these times.

Engineer Brian Book handed out his monthly report with potential grant opportunities for our Community Building. One grant specifically for roofs, upgrades to HVAC systems, master site development. We are already working on the Local Share Account Gaming Funds. Report will be kept in the minute books for referral.

President Stutts informed Council Darlene Peachey with the Ambulance was to attend, but got called to a fire just up the street. Darlene will be asked to follow-up on Christmas lights for this year at our next meeting.

Councilwoman Connie Eaton suggested tabling this topic until next meeting.

President Stutts has been approached about grounds hogs being a nuisance in the back ally here in town. Since there is an ordinance to not be able to shot in town, he suggests calling Stoner's Pest Control to see if they have services to handle these pests. Motion to call Stoner's was made by Andy Lenig and seconded by Connie Eaton.

President Stutts asked for any other comments or issues before the meeting closes. The meeting was adjourned by a motion from Councilwoman Connie Eaton and seconded by Martin Wilson at 7:35 PM.
